TORNADO SAFETY TIPS FROM NOAA

REMINDER: Tornado siren tests will be made every Saturday at noon through the month of September.

Tornado season and severe weather season is upon us. We are fortunate enough to have a warning system in place to alert the general public of any approaching tornadoes headed toward Waukeee. This system is an outdoor warning system and may not be heard if you are in a building or residence. If you hear the sirens go off, you should immediately seek shelter. Check on TV, radio stations and weather radios to try and find out about the tornado threat. If the warning sirens are blowing, a tornado has been sighted and Waukeee is very likely to be in its path.

Even though the warning sirens are helpful tools, the public should always take additional steps to ensure their safety. Listed below are some helpful safety tips:

- Listen to NOAA Weather Radio or local radio or television for tornado warnings and instructions.
- If you hear that a tornado or a storm threatens, seek shelter immediately.
- If you are in a building, go to the designated shelter, the building's basement or an interior room, such as a bathroom or closet.
- If you are in an automobile, do not try to out-drive a tornado. Abandon your vehicle and seek shelter in a ditch or depression.
- If you are in a mobile home, leave it for a more substantial structure. You should plan on heading for the storm shelter at the first sign of severe weather. As we all know from countless news stories, mobile home parks are often the scene of numerous deaths or injuries. **DO NOT RISK IT!**
- Protect your head and body from flying debris.

Stay safe and be alert to weather conditions around you!

SAFETY CITY

Safety City is available for registration and classes fill up quickly. Registration ends on May 10, 2013 at 5pm.

Safety City provides children that will begin kindergarten in the fall of 2013 with information on subjects that will allow them to start school with more safety information. Safety City has a miniature city that allows students to learn street and walking safety. A tour of the Police and Fire Department is also included.

Class fee is \$50 per student which includes a t-shirt and bicycle helmet. Classes will be held in both morning and afternoon the weeks of June 10, June 17 and June 24 at the Waukeee Middle School at 905 Warrior Lane in Waukeee. You may come to the Police Department to register your child or go to the City of Waukeee website, www.waukeee.org, and under *Police* you can download the registration form. You may then sent it to or drop it off at the Police Department at 1300 SE LA Grant Pkwy. We accept cash or checks only.



CHARACTER BUILDING ACADEMY

For 5 hours a day for 10 days, your son or daughter will experience an opportunity through military-style physical and mental challenges to develop leadership and character. The young men and women learn about the power of teamwork, the importance of respect for self and others and build the confidence to achieve their goals.

This program is open to all men and women in any area from ages 12–16. The Dallas County Sheriff's Office, Juvenile Court Services, Dallas Center Police Department and the Waukeee Police Department provide personnel to teach subjects and interact with cadets. Registration packets can be picked up from any of these agencies. Class sizes are limited so register your cadet as soon as possible.

With a mix of in-classroom topics and outdoor team building activities, the cadet will leave a little stronger, flying a little higher, standing a little taller and feeling a greater sense of accomplishment.

Cost: \$85 which includes pants, t-shirt and hat for each cadet

Dates: MEN: June 3–June 14 (no weekends)

WOMEN: June 17–June 28 (no weekends)

SEAT BELTS AND CHILD RESTRAINTS
