Alice's Road Corridor Project Update

City staff held a meeting on December 14, 2009 for property owner's within the Alice's Road Corridor Area which is an approximately 1200 acre area located between University Avenue and Interstate 80 (north-south direction) and LA Grant Parkway and Waco Place (east-west direction). The purpose of the meeting was to update owners on progress related to construction of the bridge over Interstate 80, future interchange development, future Alice's Road Extension, sanitary sewer development, funding and additional corridor planning.



ALICE'S ROAD OVERPASS AND FUTURE INTERCHANGE
Construction of the overpass over Interstate 80 is under construction and is expected to be completed in June 2010. This project also includes the construction of a temporary gravel road from Ashworth Road to the bridge which will be paved in the near future. The City and its consultants are currently working on the necessary documents to seek approval of the future Interchange at this location which is anticipated to be completed within the next five years.

ALICE'S ROAD BETWEEN ASHWORTH ROAD AND UNIVERSITY AVENUE
Design is currently underway for the construction of a six lane boulevard from University Avenue to Ashworth Road. The expectation is that a minimum three of the six lanes will be constructed in 2012 with the future lanes to be constructed when the demand warrants.

SANITARY SEWER DEVELOPMENT
A sanitary sewer line that will initially service 600 acres of the overall corridor is under final design and is anticipated to be constructed during the summer of 2010.

FUNDING
To date, approximately \$10 million in federal funding has been acquired for this project which in total will cost approximately \$47 million to develop. The City is currently awaiting notification of additional federal funding that will become available during 2010 and has been actively seeking additional funding for future years in order to complete the project.

FUTURE PLANNING
The City completed an Alice's Road Corridor Study in 2004 which generally depicted the preferred land use for the types of development within the Corridor. Staff is currently working on a proposal to build upon the existing study in creating a more detailed document that more clearly defines the goals and visions for the Corridor.

At the December 21, 2009 regular City Council meeting, Isaiah McGee was recognized for his service to the city as a council member from January 2006 through the end of December 2009. The City Council approved a resolution honoring his four years of service, after which Mayor Bill Peard presented him with a plaque.



Bailey Retires From Council After 20 Years



Council Member Donald L. Bailey, Jr. took part in his last Waukeee City Council meeting on December 21. After serving since November 1989 as either council member or mayor, Don chose not to run for re-election for another term. An open house reception was held for Don and for fellow outgoing council member Isaiah McGee later that evening, where Mayor Bill Peard presented Don with a plaque and clock in recognition of his many years of distinguished service.

When Don was first elected in 1989, Waukeee's population was 2,512. With the city's 2010 population projected to exceed 12,000, Don helped shepherd the city through an unprecedented period of growth. Some of the projects he worked to advance include the widening of both Highway 6 and University Avenue, the redevelopment of portions of the Downtown Business District and Triangle Park area, the purchase of Sugar Creek Municipal Golf Course and the Copeland Recreation and Sports Complex property, the construction of the Public Safety Building and Public Library, and the planning and solicitation of funding for the Alice's Road/105th Street Interstate 80 Interchange and Alice's Road Corridor.

At the end of the December 21 council meeting, Don spoke about his years on the council, saying, "Sitting up here, people try to give you credit, but it's the citizens in Waukeee that have been involved over the years that helped make things happen. That's who we're working for."

SNOW ORDINANCE: KEEP UP WITH THE FALLING SNOW
If an inch or more of snow is forecast, Waukeee will implement our snow ordinance: \$502.17 – No person shall park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley or city-owned off-street parking area during any snow emergency proclaimed by the chief of police or his designee unless the snow has been removed or plowed from said street, alley or parking area and the snow has ceased to fall. A snow emergency parking ban shall continue from its proclamation through the duration of the snow or ice storm and the forty-eight (48) hour period after cessation of such storm except as above provided upon streets, which have been fully opened.

Every attempt is made to get city streets clear of snow as quickly and safely as possible after a snow storm. Please consider moving your vehicle off the street prior to retiring for the evening or departing for work in the morning when snow is forecast. If the snow ordinance is put into effect during the overnight hours, consideration will be given to allow citizens time to move their vehicles the next morning.

The ordinance is announced on the following television and radio stations: Television: KCCI (8), WHO (13), WOI (5), WAUKEE CABLE STATION (7). Radio: WHO, KKDM, KPTL, KXNO, KDRB, KIOA (AM & FM), KRNT (AM & FM), KSTZ, KAZR, KPSZ, KWKY, KJUY, KGGG (AM & FM), KGGG, KLT1, KHKI. If you are issued a citation for violation of the snow ordinance, the fine is \$25.00 and your vehicle could be impounded.

NOTICE TO JOGGERS AND MOTORISTS
We have noticed joggers out in the early morning and evening hours. Some of the joggers have dark clothing and cannot be easily seen. This is to remind joggers to wear bright or light clothing and to remind motorists to watch for these joggers. With the snow on the streets it is doubly dangerous for joggers to be in the street. They should use sidewalks and shoulders whenever possible.

WINTER WEATHER AND PETS
Citizens are urged to make sure that pets left outside are properly taken care of. Doghouses should be put out of the direct line of wind, be insulated and have sufficient, clean bedding. Remember to make sure pets have adequate food and fresh water daily. Dogs and cats are subject to hypothermia and frostbite. The Police Department receives calls each year concerning animals that are not being properly cared for. We do investigate these incidents. If we find an owner negligent, criminal charges could be filed and the animal removed from the property for its protection and medical treatment.
