## NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION FUNDING REQUEST DEADLINE

Non-profit organizations that provide services for Waukeee citizens and would like to apply for funding from the City of Waukeee in the upcoming fiscal year 2014 must submit a formal letter of request to the Interim City Administrator no later than November 30, 2012. The letter of request must include the following information:

- The IRS status of the organization.
- The purpose or intent of the organization.
- Explanation of how funds will be utilized.
- Itemized budget for the year of the request plus itemized actuals for the past 5 years, including revenues and expenditures in all reports.
- Copy of last two audit reports.
- List of Board of Directors for the organization, including home addresses and phone numbers.
- List of names and wages of paid staff.

City staff will review all applications received by the deadline and make a recommendation to the City Council for the distribution of funds. The City Council will approve funding no later than March 15, 2013. Contact Interim City Administrator Brad Deets at 987-4522 or bdeets@waukeee.org if you have any questions.

### WAUKEE CHRISTMAS DRIVE

The annual Waukeee Christmas Drive will commence on November 1, 2012. The Waukeee Christmas Drive is a project, coordinated by employees, to obtain food and gifts for families in need in our school district. Cash donations are also accepted to help purchase toys and food to make sure families have the supplies they need.

We also have an 'adoption' program. Families are 'adopted' either by a family, organization or business. They buy and wrap the gifts from a list provided then deliver the items to the Police Department for distribution with the food. We had a great response to this program last year and hope to again this year.

Last year we assisted 126 families to include 341 children and 27 senior citizens. We expect this number to be even greater this year.

Donation Information: We ask for new, unwrapped toys will be accepted. No clothing will be accepted. Paper products such as paper towels, toilet tissue, hand soap, laundry aids or cleaning products are greatly appreciated. The food and above items should be delivered to the Waukeee Food Pantry at Westview Church.

Donations of cash and toys will be taken at the Waukeee Police Department from November 1st thru December 17th (monetary donations are taken year round). We ask that those wanting to make a monetary donation to make checks payable to 'Waukeee Christmas Fund'.

## SNOW ORDINANCE

Citizens should keep alert of the weather conditions and snow advisories so you can determine if your vehicle should be removed from the street. Snow crews are out early. By leaving your vehicle on the street it could hamper snow removal. You will want to listen to radio/local TV, as they will be notified of the snow ordinance being put into effect. Other alerts can come through NIXLE, Facebook and Twitter. By paying attention to weather conditions you can avoid a citation for parking during the ordinance. In some cases vehicles will be towed at the owners expense. No one shall leave vehicles parked on the street, alley or city owned off-street parking during snow emergencies unless snow has been removed and snow has ceased to fall. Notice: Fines are \$25.00 for snow ordinance violations.

## PARKING FOR SPECIAL OCCASIONS

With holiday parties and family gatherings, special permission for parking will usually be granted if the Police Department is notified in advance of your plans. We do ask that after the permission is given you keep your guests parked on only one side of the street so emergency vehicles can get through.

## STEP PROGRAM

The Waukeee Police Department participates in the Special Traffic Enforcement Program through the Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau.

Special enforcement will be conducted from November 19th through November 25th to help keep all driver's and passengers safe during the Thanksgiving holiday season.
