## SNOW ORDINANCE

If an inch or more of snow is forecast, Waukeee, along with most other metro cities, will implement our snow ordinance. If the snow ordinance is put into effect during the overnight hours, consideration will be given to allow citizens time to move their vehicles the next morning.

Every attempt is made to get our streets clear of snow as quickly and safely as possible after a snow storm. Please give consideration to moving your vehicle off the street prior to retiring for the evening or departing for work in the morning when snow is forecast.

### CARBON MONOXIDE

This time of year, with homes closed for the winter, carbon monoxide poisoning becomes an issue. Even new homes can have furnace problems. Some people contribute their illnesses to colds and flu since the symptoms are almost identical. It is a good idea to have your furnace checked once a year and invest in a carbon monoxide detector. Parents may want to take time to talk with their teenagers and other family members regarding carbon monoxide from vehicles. Vehicles should be checked regularly to make sure the exhaust system is working properly, there are no holes in the pipe and that the fumes are being vented out the back of the vehicle and not coming back inside through the trunk or other areas. Everyone should be cautioned against sitting in their vehicles for long periods of time with the vehicles running and the windows closed. Carbon monoxide can sneak up on you without your even knowing it since it is odorless and colorless. Both home and vehicle carbon monoxide poisoning can be deadly. Remember not to warm your car inside a garage even with the door open. Fumes can overcome you without your knowledge. Be careful, alert and safe!
