

NEW RESTAURANTS AND SERVICES OPENING IN WILLIAMS POINTE RETAIL CENTER

Construction on the Williams Pointe Retail Center at Hickman Road and SE Waco Place in Waukee is complete and businesses will be moving into the center this fall. The center's location is proving to be appealing to businesses because it offers a high traffic volume from Hickman Road - more than 23,000 vehicles per day according to a 2012 study. The 18,000-square foot Williams Pointe Retail Center will be home to Louie's Wine Dive, Polished Nail Salon, 1908 Draught House and a Verizon Wireless store.

The Draught House is becoming a popular sports bar and restaurant in the Metro, with 1908 Draught House in Johnston and a future Buffy's Draught House in West Des Moines. The pub features 20 beers on tap along with lunch and dinner service.

Louie's Wine Dive calls several cities in the Midwest home, including Des Moines. The restaurant features more than 100 distinct wines from around the world and was named one of "10 Great Restaurants with a Stellar Wine List" in 2013 by USA Today. Louie's features a weekend brunch, lunch and dinner service. The restaurant currently has a location in Des Moines on University, along with locations in Omaha, Kansas City and Minneapolis. The Waukee restaurant will be larger than the Des Moines business and will feature a private dining room for special events.
