Waukeee Police Department to Offer Inaugural Citizen Police Academy

Waukeee, Iowa—The Waukeee Police Department is proud to offer their very first Citizen Police Academy to Waukeee businesses and residents. The Citizen Police Academy will take place November 6, 2014-January 29, 2015, as a 30-hour block of instruction designed to give the public a working knowledge of the practices, policies and procedures governing the Waukeee Police Department. The academy consists of 10 three-hour sessions conducted on a weekly basis and an optional ride-along with a patrol officer.

“We are excited to offer this service to our residents,” said Waukeee Police Chief John Quinn. “It will not only be educational, but fun and interactive. It will give our residents an inside look at how our police force works.”

The academy’s comprehensive instruction will cover different areas routinely addressed by local law enforcement. The sessions have been designed to incorporate an interactive format, providing participants with a hands-on experience whenever practical. Instructors are certified police officers, supervisors and other personnel with expertise in various areas.
