City of Waukeee Announces 2014 Citizen of the Year

Waukeee, Iowa— Long-time Waukeee resident and local photographer, Terry Snyder, was named Waukeee's 2014 Citizen of the Year. Waukeee Mayor Bill Peard named Snyder as Citizen of the Year at the regular Waukeee City Council meeting on Monday, April 6, 2015.

Snyder was chosen for the honor by a committee consisting of Mayor Peard; Dr. Dave Wilkerson, superintendent for the Waukeee Community School District; Matt Klein, Waukeee Area Chamber of Commerce President; and 2013 Citizen of the Year Geoff Warmouth.

Snyder was selected because of her service to the community, most notably through her work with the Waukeee Area Historical Society. Snyder was a key member on a Historical Society Committee that recently created and printed a book about Waukeee's history.

"Terry received multiple nominations for this honor and is highly regarded in the community for her leadership, volunteerism, and historical preservation efforts," said Waukeee Mayor Bill Peard. "Not to mention her high levels of energy and enthusiasm for all things Waukeee."

As Citizen of the Year, Snyder will be honored at an open house reception yet to be scheduled, where she will be presented with a proclamation and Key to the City by Mayor Peard. She will also have the honor of riding in the Celebrate Waukeee and 4th of July parades.
