City of Waukeee Seeks Applicants for 2016 Boards and Commissions

Waukeee, Iowa—The City of Waukeee is seeking applications from residents who would like to become members of one of the City's many important boards and commissions. Openings exist on all boards and commissions, including the Board of Appeals, Community and Economic Development and Advisory Council (CEDAC), Library Board of Trustees, Park Board, Planning and Zoning Commission, and Zoning Board of Adjustment.

Boards and commissions are an established feature of municipal government offering citizens an opportunity to participate in Waukeee's governmental affairs. Their activities help to shape or influence public policy in many areas, and they reflect the varied interests of residents.

All terms expire on January 31 with appointments beginning February 1, with the exception of the Library Board of Trustees, for which appointments begin July 1. Appointments are made by the mayor, with approval of the city council at the second regular city council meeting in January, with the exception of the Library Board of Trustees, for which appointments are made at the second regular city council meeting in June.
