Waukeee, Iowa— The City of Waukeee is seeking applications from residents who would like to become members of one of the City's many important boards and commissions. Applications for seats on the following City boards and commissions are **due by Wednesday, Nov. 30, 2016**.

- **The Board of Appeals** meets on an as-needed basis to consider appeals related to City building codes. *(Two open seats)*
- **The Community and Economic Development Advisory Council (CEDAC)** acts as an advisory group to the City's Community and Economic Development Department. *(Two open seats)*
- **The Library Board of Trustees** sets the direction of the Waukeee Public Library through goal-setting and adopting policies. *(Three open seats)*
- **The Park Board** facilitates planning and improving parks, trails, open spaces, etc. Members organize community programs and events. *(Three open seats)*
- **The Planning and Zoning Commission** acts as a recommending board to the City Council on development proposals, rezoning applications and site plans. *(One open seat)*
- **The Zoning Board of Adjustment** meets when an application is presented for consideration as it applies to a variance from the Zoning Ordinance. *(One open seat)*
