

CITY OF WAUKEE GARBAGE CUSTOMERS

Waste Management will be collecting yard waste for City of Waukee garbage customers every Monday from April through November. If there is a holiday which falls on a Monday, the collection day will be delayed by one day.

ITEMS CONSIDERED YARD WASTE:

Yard waste is vegetation including materials such as grass clippings, leaves, brush and garden waste.

Waste Management is unable to pick up dirt and sod.

Yard waste must be put into biodegradable bags or reusable containers with a 50 pound maximum weight. Sticks, brush and branches must be cut into 4 foot lengths and bundled (with string or twine) with a 50 pound maximum weight per bundle. If they will fit into a small reusable container they will not need to be bundled.



DO NOT USE YOUR WASTE MANAGEMENT GARBAGE OR RECYCLING CONTAINERS FOR YARD WASTE.

Place the approved items at the curb for collection. Items can be set out the night before or before 7 a.m. the day of collection. If your items are missed, please call 515-978-5502 by 10 a.m. the following day to report it, so the collection can be rescheduled.



Portable Irrigation Meter Certification

If you own a *portable* irrigation meter, have the meter certified this spring before you start using it. If you moved here within the past year it may be that the previous owner had a meter. Please check to see if they left it for you. For readings to be accepted from a portable irrigation meter it is necessary that this meter be certified *yearly*. If your meter has not been certified yearly it has been removed from your account. When you do bring it in to certify it, the current read will be your new start read. **To have your meter certified, please take it to the Utility Billing Office in City Hall** at 230 W. Hickman Road (not the Public Works Building). Office hours are Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.



Citywide Clean-Up Day Scheduled for Saturday May 7, 2016

Citywide Clean-Up Day will be held Saturday, May 7. Clean-Up Day provides the opportunity to get rid of bulky waste like furniture and other items by putting them out on the curb by 7 a.m. Curbside pick-up does not apply to those living in neighborhood associations and apartment complexes. Dispose of hazardous materials at Vince Meyer Learning Center (445 5th Street), and drop off old appliances, electronics and tires at the former Public Works Building (1205 6th Street).
