

Resident Checklist

Sign Up for Utilities

- Water, gas, garbage and sewer are City of Waukee-run utilities. Visit Waukee City Hall at 230 W. Hickman Road to set up utilities in person and pay deposits. Deposits are \$50 each for gas and water for property owners and \$100 each for renters. Call 515-978-5502 in advance to save time during the set-up process.
- Electricity can be activated by calling MidAmerican Energy at 1-888-427-5632 or by visiting www.midamericanenergy.com/moving.

Check on Property Taxes

 If you are a homeowner with property taxes not built into a mortgage, please call the Dallas County Treasurer at 515-993-5808 to inquire about your respective property taxes.

Update Driver's License

- If you have a current lowa Driver's License, you may be able to update it with your new Waukee address at the Waukee Hy-Vee Driver's License kiosk. Hy-Vee is located at 1005 E. Hickman Road. You will need to bring your existing license and pay via credit or debit card. Kiosk renewal is not applicable for those with CDLs, foreign nationals and other restrictions.
- You may also qualify for online renewal. Visit https://mymvd.iowadot.gov/ to see if you meet the requirements.
- If you prefer in-person renewal, are coming from out-of-state or have other restrictions, please visit www.iowadot.gov to locate driver's license stations in the area.

Register Motor Vehicles

- If you are moving here from another lowa county, by updating your driver's license, your vehicle registration will automatically transfer to Dallas County. Be sure to check that your annual registration renewal mailing is indeed sent by Dallas County. It is not required that you change out your license plates; however, you can do so for \$5. Call 515-993-5812 with questions.
- If you are moving here from out of state, please visit the Dallas County Treasurer's Office at 918 Court Street in Adel.

Register to Vote

There are several ways to register to vote in Dallas County:

- If you have updated your lowa Driver's License with your current Waukee address, you can register electronically at http://sos.iowa.gov/.
- To print a mailable form from the Dallas County Auditor, visit www.waukee.org/voterreg.
- You may register to vote in person at the Dallas County Auditor's Office located at 210 N. 10th Street in Adel. Please call 515-993-4751 with questions.

Register Pets

 To register pets with the City, please visit www.petdata.com or call 1-855-585-8157 toll-free. Dog and cat licenses are \$15 for altered pets and \$25 for unaltered pets. Waukee residents are required to license pets annually per City ordinance. A proof of rabies vaccination is required. No more than three cats and three dogs are permitted.

Get a Library Card

 Visit the Waukee Public Library at 950 Warrior Lane. Children (with adult present) must be 7 or older to sign up for a card. Adults must show photo IDs. To start the process ahead of time, visit www.waukeepubliclibrary.org

Codes and Regulations

Snow Removal: Property owners are expected to remove snow, ice and accumulations from sidewalks within 24 hours after the end of a weather event. The City will issue fines beginning at \$50 for those in violation of the snow removal ordinance.

Snow Emergency Parking Ban: If snow is forecast for Waukee, the City's snow ordinance and parking ban will go into effect. Public street parking is not permitted during the ban. Those in violation are subject to a \$25 fine and/or towing.

Lawn and Weed Maintenance: Lawns and weeds should not be allowed to grow more than 12 inches high on the average, according to the City's property maintenance code. Violations will result in a \$90 fine or the cost of City-hired maintenance, whichever is greater.

Fire Pits: The City allows residents to maintain a fire with untreated wood for recreational, religious, ceremonial, cooking, warmth or similar purposes. Burning rubbish/refuse which includes yard waste, tires, garbage or plastics is not permitted.

Garbage and Recycling

Curbside solid waste and recycling pick-up both occur weekly in the City of Waukee at 7 a.m. or later. If you are moving into a newly constructed home, your containers will be delivered to you within five business days. If you are moving into an existing home, the containers should be left for you by the previous homeowner. Call 515-964-5229 with questions.

The number of items you may set out is not limited. If you have more than will fit into the receptacle, you may bag it and place it alongside. There are special requirements for appliances, furniture and other bulky items.

Spring Clean-Up Week is held in late April/early May for free, curbside disposal of bulky items. The first Saturday in May, the City will designate drop-off sites for hazardous materials, appliances and tires as well.

Curbside yard waste pick-up occurs every Monday beginning at 7 a.m. from April through November.

Irrigation Meters

The City of Waukee offers two types of irrigation meters for purchase. The benefit of purchasing a meter for irrigation purposes such as watering the lawn/sod or filling a pool is that you do not pay sewer charges on water readings by the separate irrigation meter.

- A portable irrigation meter that attaches to a 5/8" garden hose can be purchased for \$100 in the Utility Billing Office located at 230 W. Hickman Road.
- 2) A permanent in-house irrigation meter can be installed by the Water Department after a plumber has appropriately diverted the plumbing. The typical use for this meter is if you have an underground irrigation system. Contact the Public Works Department at 515-978-7920. The charge for this meter is \$347.

Building Permits


